## Catch Up Funding 2020-2021

St. Mary's has been allocated £17,521 of catch up funding to support children to catch up lost time after school closure due to the pandemic.										
Identified Impact of Lockdown:										
Maths	Specific content has been missed, leading to gaps in learning for all pupils. Rigorous, regular teaching of instant recall facts did not take place and therefore knowledge of these is not cemented as it should be. This includes times tables, number bonds, etc. Some pupils who felt anxious about their ability in maths need reassurance and extra support in order to bring them up to where they should be.									
Reading	Pupils did not have access to books from the school library and were not necessarily heard read regularly. Whole class reading session could not take place and so pupils did not hear each other read or have the opportunity to talk about the book. Comprehension skills need improving.									
Writing	Pupils did not have the opportunity for shared writing as a class and writing produced at home was not always high quality or of a good length. Pupils need more opportunities for extended writing and class shared writing. Activities such as the Big Write need to be reintroduced.									
Non-Core Subjects	These were well catered for during lockdown but PE activities (team games etc) were missed - this will be covered by Sports Premium Plan. Other practical activities such as science experiments also need to be given a high priority.
