Dear Parents,

I hope you have all had a wonderful Christmas break and that your child is excited about being back at school for the Spring Term. Mrs Gaffney and I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to you all for your very kind gifts, cards and Christmas wishes, we very much appreciated them.

Prayer and RE learning

This term our theme is Parables and Miracles, Special Celebrations, Lent and Holy Week. We will learn about some of the parables Jesus told his disciples and the messages that these teach us about how we should live our lives. We will be looking at the miracles Jesus performed and what they teach us about Jesus. We will also learn about Baptism and Marriage as special sacramental celebrations. During the season of Lent, we will be thinking about what we can do to get closer to God and discussing our journey through Lent coming to its conclusion at the end of Holy Week.

Maths

We will start by focusing on money, learning how to count and record amounts of money in pounds and pence, choose coins to make different totals and solve real life addition and subtractions money problems. We will then move on to multiplication and division. We will write multiplication sentences and use arrays, grouping and sharing to solve problems. We will also learn how to measure in centimetres and metres before comparing and ordering heights and lengths.

English

Over the next two terms we will be planning and writing countdown poems and looking at diary writing and newspaper reports. We will be learning about different word classes and how we can use descriptive language to improve our writing. We will also look at how we can use

conjunctions to add further detail to our sentences. We will continue to focus on handwriting and sentence structure.

We will be reading a range of non-fiction and fiction texts as a whole class to answer questions and complete activities based on what we have read. We use the acronym VIPERS to help us focus our reading on vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and sequencing.

Phonics

In phonics this term, we will be learning new graphemes for the following sounds: or, ur, ou, oi, eer, air, s and j. We will also learn how to add the -es suffix to verbs ending in y and how to add the suffixes -er, -est, -ing and -ed to a root word ending in a y with a consonant before it.

Reading

Each child will continue to receive two home reading books on a Tuesday and these need to be read with an adult at home and returned into school the following Monday. Remember to talk to your child about the book and use the questions on the inside of the front cover to check your child's understanding of what has been read. It is incredibly important that your child reads with you regularly at home in order to increase their reading fluency.

Topic

Our History focus over the next two terms is The Great Fire of London. We will become History Detectives to use sources of evidence to work out where, when and how the fire started. In the role of a History Detective, we will also use history sources to find evidence to explain how we know what happened in The Great Fire of London. We will also look at the causes of the fire and reasons why it spread.

In Science we will learn about the parts of a plant and what they need to stay healthy. We will also compare plants and trees.

Virtues for the two terms:

Spring 1: Compassionate and Loving

We are compassionate when we feel sympathy and concern for other people who are in difficulty, whether they are near to us or far away. We are loving when we show our sympathy and concern for other people by our actions and by our words.

Spring 2: Faith-Filled and Hopeful

We have to build on it every day through prayer, being part of the faith community of St Mary's and living out the Gospel values.

Expectations for home learning in

Year 2
